



# COVID-19 Response

At Craine House, we are navigating these unprecedented times by making decisions to help keep the women in our care safe and healthy to the best of our ability. In addition to following the Indiana Department of Corrections and Marion County Corrections regulations regarding all of our residents (as we always do), we are adhering to CDC guidance and Governor Holcomb's mandates relative to COVID-19, aka coronavirus.

As of now, healthy employees of essential businesses (as defined by Holcomb's mandate), have the ability to continue working. This applies to many of our residents and means they have continued to work by following the measures their employer has taken during this time. We continue to monitor the evolving state of our country and will make any necessary updates and changes as information is shared by our governing bodies (federal, state, and local).

Additionally, Craine House has made facility changes and stepped up sanitation to maintain a clean environment for everyone who lives and works in the building. This includes:

- Working with the appropriate channels to make sure our residents with ongoing medical conditions are safe and protected
- Cleaning the facility 3 times per day
- Maintaining a fully stocked cleaning cart that is available to anyone at any time to help keep the environment sanitary
- Provide and allow residents to keep hand sanitizer, which meets CDC recommendations, on them at all times
- Temporarily suspend all visitations and home visits to minimize those entering and exiting the building
- Mandating every resident see an on-site therapist at least once a week to address any additional stress due to COVID-19
- Allowing only 5 people in day rooms at any given time

We hope this gives you a sense of the measures we are taking to maintain a safe environment for our residents and staff and answers your questions or concerns.
